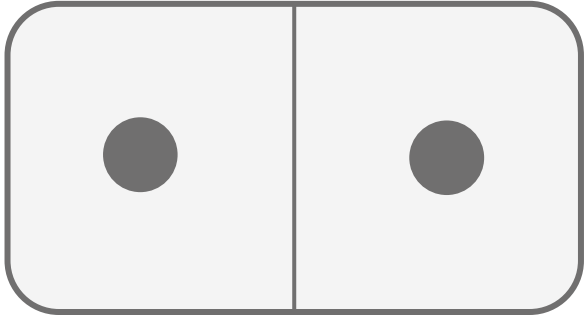
Look at the dice. Double the spots and write the answer in the box.

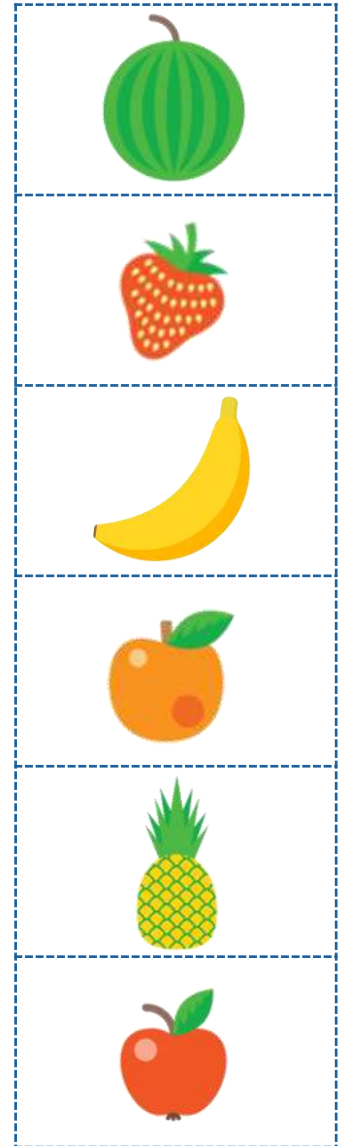






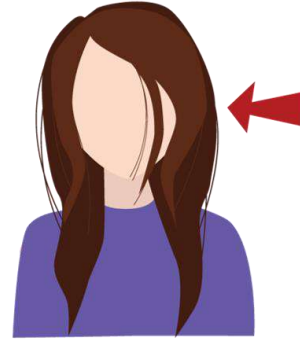






Phonics – Match the Picture to the Phase 3 Sound

Paint a picture of you doing an activity that you really enjoy.

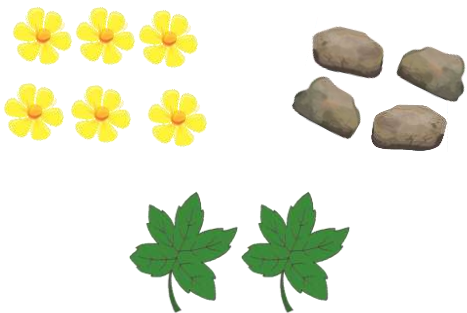


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Ask your child to paint a picture to help their new teacher find out more about him or her. Set up paints, paper and drawing materials, and talk about your child's favourite activities.

Write 3 sentences about yourself.

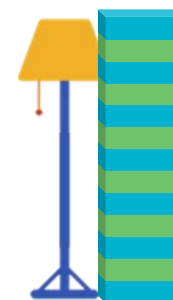

Activity Outcomes

- Your child will learn how to measure different objects using blocks.

Setting up

What you will need

- Toys of different sizes such as toy dinosaurs or cars.
- Building blocks to measure with.

Activity Guide

Activity – Toy Measuring

- Give your child building blocks and toys of different sizes.
- They must measure the height or length of each toy by building the blocks to the matching height/length.
- Repeat the activity with the rest of the toys.

Questions you could ask your child during the activity

- What is the tallest toy?
- What is the shortest toy?
- How many blocks were used for the shortest toy?
